Activities:



Have children stand and choose one volunteer. While everyone else turns around, have the volunteer change one small thing about their appearance (pulling socks up or down, buttoning a sweater, changing hair, etc.). Have everyone turn around and try to figure out what has changed. Let each student have a turn being the volunteer.

Even though the person did something different, they were really still the same. You knew they were still the same person and had not changed. Abraham trusted that God was still the same, even though His instructions to him were different than what he knew before.

What things could people love more than God? TV, sports, being popular, etc. What things might we have to sacrifice (give up) to serve God better? Examples: Our favorite TV program if it comes on during worship time, Sunday morning Little League, toys or clothes to someone whose house burned, popularity from choosing not to copy the crowd, bad habits, etc. Maybe there are things that God doesn't actually want you to give up (your toys, playing soccer, ice cream) but He does want you to be willing to give them up if you had to).


Encourage children to mold something God has given them.
