

Activities:



Split children into two equal teams. Set up two bowls filled with enough flour to fill two jars. Place one spoon next to each jar. Make a starting line with masking tape. Have children run a relay race where they get the spoon, take one spoonful of flour and place it in the jar, then set it down and go to the back of the line.

Have children practice being good messengers. Call one child to you, whisper a command to them and tell them who to deliver the message to. The child will whisper the message in that child's ear, who then acts out the command.

Commands:

Stomp your feet.

Clap your hands.

Jump up and down ten times.

Turn the lights off and on three times.

Rub your stomach and pat your head.

Turn around in a circle.

Plank on a chair.

Hop on one foot.

Untie your shoes and tie them again.

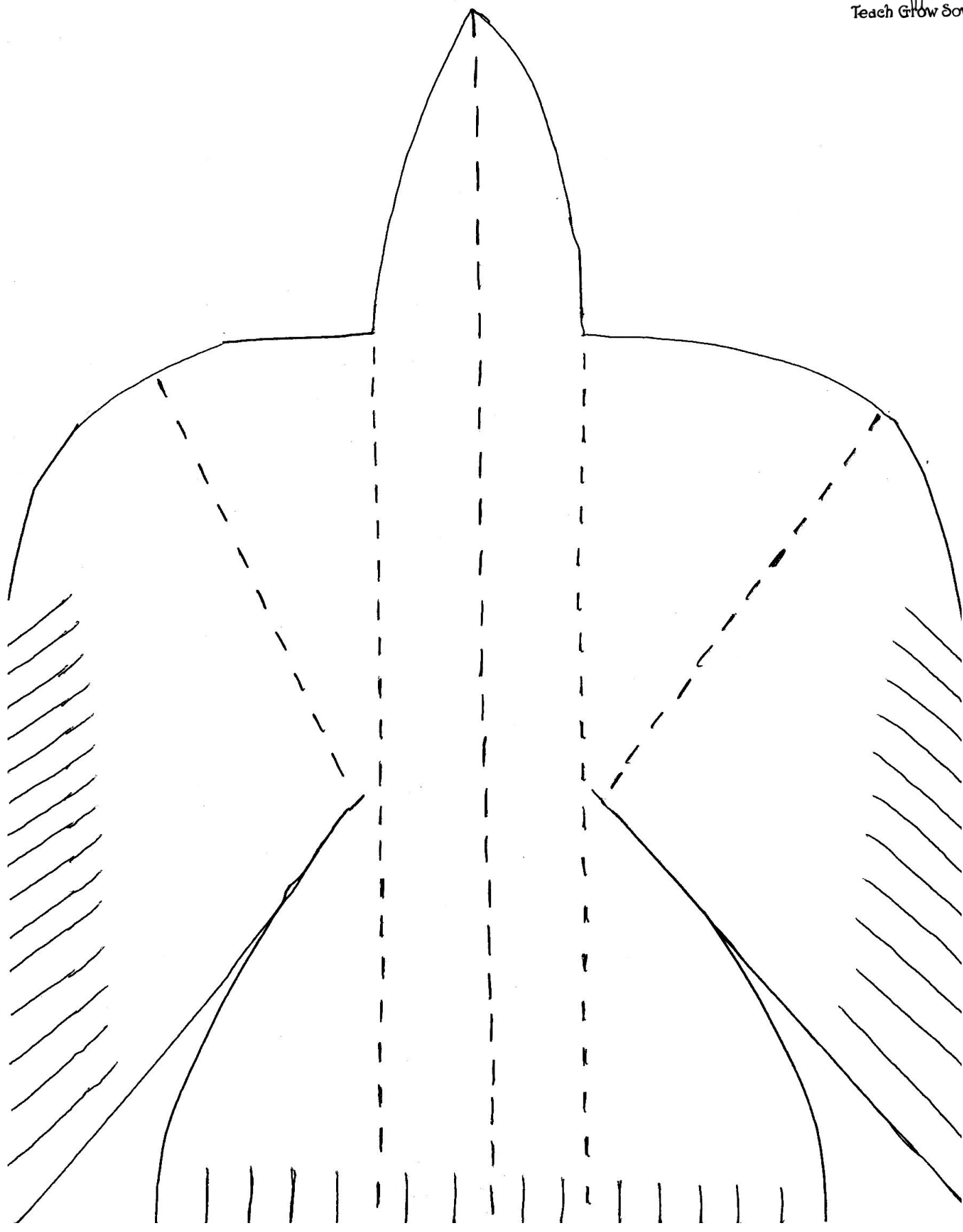
You will drink from the rock, and I have directed the ravens to supply you with food there. ~ 1 Kings 17:4

Coloring Page:

Encourage children to make something from the story, like a bird.

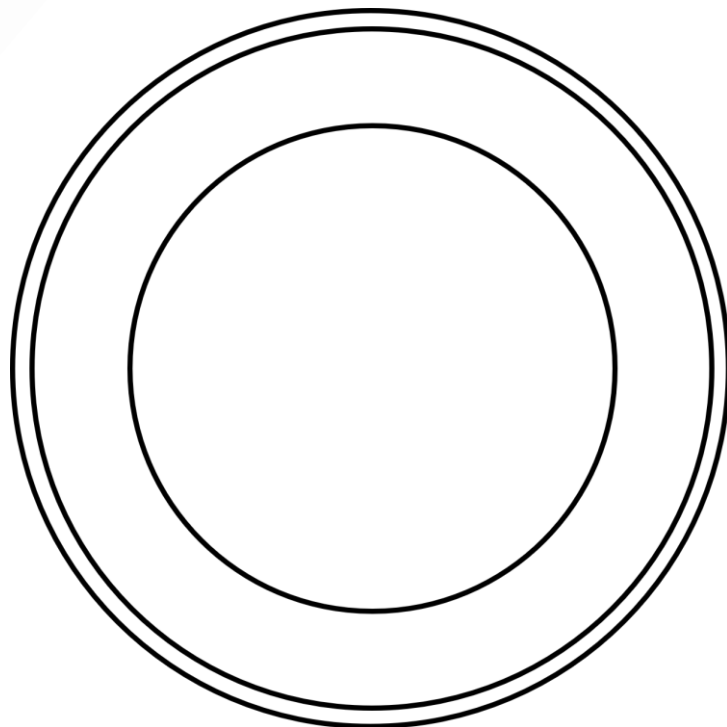
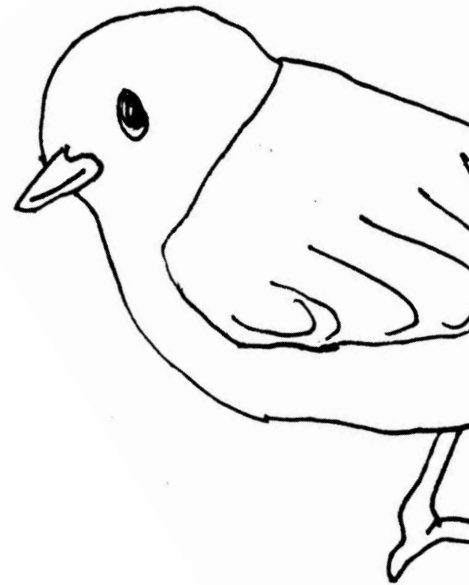
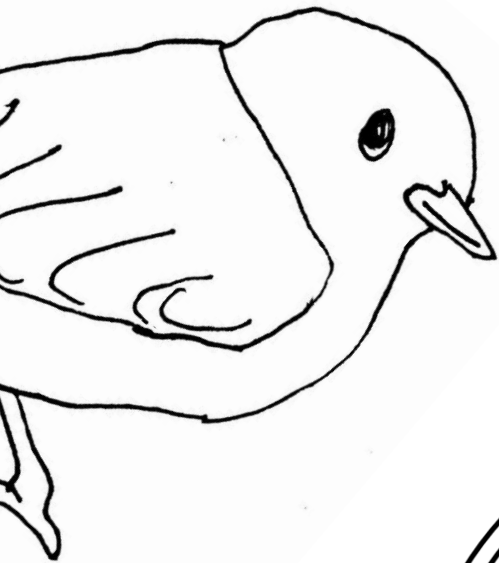
Game:

Grab a piece of bread and tear it into pieces. Let children take turns being Elijah. Have children bring bread pieces, one at a time (but no eating allowed). Talk about how God can take care of any impossible situation. Elijah could feel peace even when he didn't know where his food would come from.

Have you ever seen a bird carrying food in its beak? This is how they feed their babies. Imagine being Elijah and feeling like you are a baby bird waiting for the mommy bird to bring you food. Have children sit in a circle on the rug and pretend to be birds in a nest, while you drop toy food into the middle of the circle.
