Activities:





Display a shoe, an umbrella, a hat, a bottle of sunscreen, a tablecloth and a boot. Ask children to try and figure out what they all have in common (all of these items protect something). Discuss how God always protects His children.


Show children the fish. Just as Nebuchadnezzar's dream had warned, the Babylonian Empire (the gold head) was taken over by the Medo-Persian Empire (the silver chest and arms). The Medo-Persian Empire, ruled by Cyrus the Great, conquered Babylon. The Medo-Persian Empire was an even bigger empire and the Babylonian Empire was now just one of its kingdoms. Darius was the new king of Babylon.


Show children a jar. This represents the world. Fill the jar halfway with water. This represents people who don't know God. Pour oil into the jar. This represents followers of God. Pour food coloring into the jar. This represents things like of this world like pride, jealousy and greed. The oil repels the coloring. The droplets pass straight through and colors the water. But followers of God are not perfect. Sometimes we sin and we become like the "world". Stir all together so the food coloring mixes with oil. We need to repent and let God work in our hearts. Let everything settle so the food coloring returns to the water. Turn off the lights. Shine a flashlight behind the jar. The light won't shine through the bottom part but lights up the oil. The Holy Spirit lights up our hearts and helps us to make the right decisions.


