### Theodore Geisel, "Dr. Seuss"



Theodor Seuss Geisel, better known by his pen name Dr. Seuss, was born on March 2, 1904, in Springfield, Massachusetts. While at college, he began using the penname, Dr. Seuss.

Geisel illustrated articles in *LIFE* and *Vanity Fair, The Saturday Evening Post*, and in advertisements for Standard Oil. During World War II, he drew cartoons for a liberal political magazine, and made posters promoting the war effort. While his cartoons criticized unfair treatments of Jewish Americans and African Americans, they showed mistrustful views of Japanese Americans as the USA was at war with Japan.

He began writing and illustrating children's books, eventually publishing over 60 between 1930s-1990s. His books received notice because of their whimsical characters, dream-like illustrations, and silly rhymes. The simple style of his writing led his books to become favorites for early readers developing their skills.

Geisel died on September 24, 1991, at the age of 87, in La Jolla, California. Six of his books stopped being published in 2021 because Dr. Seuss had used the ethnic stereotypes popular at the time to depict different groups of people. He also drew criticism for his support of unfair treatment of Japanese Americans during World War II. After visiting Japan in 1953, Geisel had come to regret these early choices. As a means of atonement, he dedicated his book, Horton Hears a Who!, a political allegory about treating others equally, to a Japanese friend in 1954. He also went on to publish The Sneetches in 1961, which is an allegory for racism.

## Life Lessons
