

The candy fish remind us of the many miracles Jesus did, like feeding thousands of people bread and fish.


Matthew 11:5

The grape candy reminds us of the last seder Jesus shared with His disciples.


John 13:3-5

The whistle reminds us of the prophets in the Old Testament who promised a Savior would come to rescue people from their sin.


Isaiah 9:6

Genesis 1:1-2



The candy corn reminds us of the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Three-in-One God. Together since forever.



The Goldfish remind us of the many miracles Jesus did, like feeding thousands of people bread and fish.



The grape reminds us of the last seder Jesus shared with His disciples.



The Bugle cracker reminds us of the prophets in the Old Testament who promised a Savior would come to rescue people from their sin.




