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For the student who is a true artist, showing inspiration and attention to detail in every drawing, sculpture, paper creation, and whose creativity extends to class projects in other subjects.

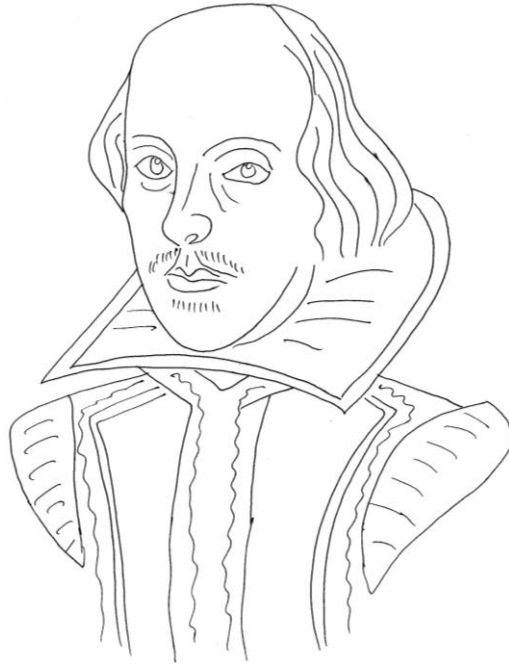
# Sun Tzu Award

equality in the classroom.

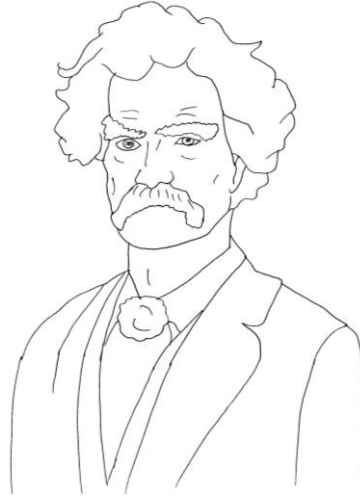
# Harriet Tubman Award

ahead of your own.

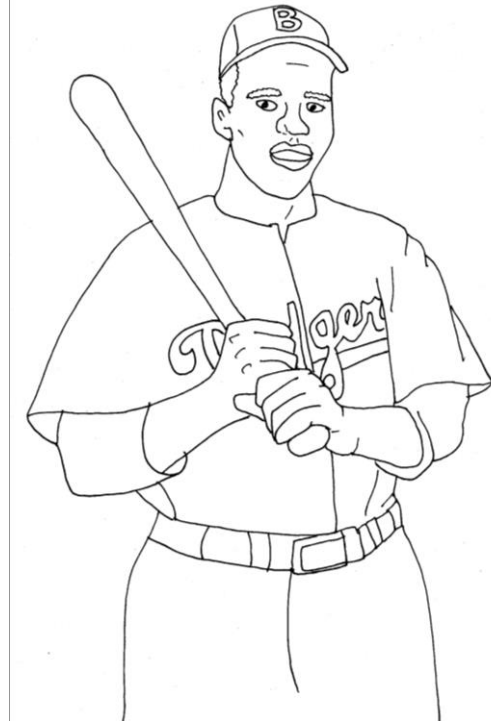
# Mark Twain Award

discipline.

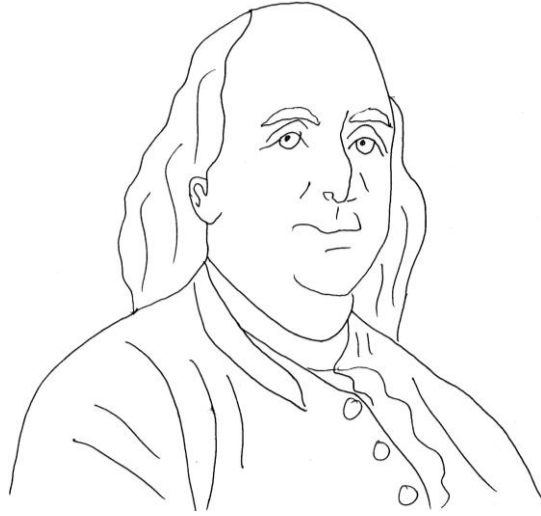
# Thomas Edison Award
