A History of Veterans Day



Veteran's Day honors all American veterans of all wars, but is especially meant to honor those who are currently living. Veterans Day began as a holiday to honor the soldiers who fought in World War I, which began in 1914, and which the USA joined in 1917. At the time this was called the "Great War." The word "Great" has a different meaning in history than in how it is used by most people today. Like the Great Depression and the Great Fire, the word "Great" means huge and memorable, not morally good. Many people at the time believed it would be the last war ever and also called it "the war to end all wars."

The fighting stopped at the 11th hour, on the 11th day of the 11th month (November). Another word for an end to fighting is armistice. After the war the anniversary of the armistice became known as Armistice Day. It became a federal holiday in 1938. After World War II, the "Great War" became known as World War I and Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day in 1954.

Veterans Day Traditions

- Many places have two minutes of silence starting at exactly 11 am on November 11th.
- Many cities have Veterans Day parades.
- Arlington National Cemetery is a cemetery for soldiers killed in battle. The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier is dedicated to soldiers who die but cannot be identified. Since 1958, there has been an official ceremony to lay a wreath on this tomb every Veterans Day.
- In some countries a red poppy is worn.
- Some other countries that fought in WWI also call the day Remembrance Day.


