Introduction:

Have all the children run in place. Ask them to name things people might run away from:


- a bee


“Your descendants will spread over the earth in all directions and become as numerous as the grains of sand. Your family will be a blessing to all people. Wherever you go, I will watch over you.”

Closing Discussion:



What did Jacob see in his dream? (angels going up and down a staircase, God speaking to him)

What promises did God make to Jacob? (to give him the land where he was, to make his children a great nation that would bless the whole earth) Do you remember who else God made this promise to? (his grandfather, Abraham)

After spending twenty years with his uncle, Jacob became rich and had a big family. How do you think this made him feel about himself? (proud) How was Jacob planning to get his brother to forgive him? (buying forgiveness with gifts)

Who came to wrestle with Jacob the night before he met Esau? (God) What did God do for Jacob? (blessed him and gave him a new name, Israel)

How was Jacob different after wrestling with God? (he was injured, his limp humbled him) Can we earn forgiveness from God with gifts? (no) Does God want us to be humble? (yes)

Just like Esau forgave Jacob with open arms, God wants to forgive us of the bad things we do with open arms. He loves us and just wants us to come to Him with humble, gentle hearts.

Harder Option


- ❖ Children glue popsicle sticks together to make ladder
- ❖ Children cut out angels
- ❖ Teacher hole punches angels and strings yarn through
- ❖ Children pull angels up and down ladder



Easier Option

- ❖ Print ladder onto cardstock
- ❖ Children cut out ladder halves and glue/tape together
- ❖ Children color angels and cut around boxes only
- ❖ Teacher hole punches angels and strings yarn through
- ❖ Children pull angels up and down ladder
