## Intro:




measuring tape	<p>Go into the hallway and have two students take opposite ends of a measuring tape. Stretch it out all the way. Now ask them to shake hands. Can they do it? (no)</p>	 <p>Can we measure the distance between us and God?</p>  <p>Who is our "ladder" to connect us to Heaven?</p>
ladder and cross	<p>Just like they can't reach across the measuring tape to shake hands, Jacob must have realized that he was very far away from God; he had done bad things, and so there was a huge distance between himself and God. In his dream, Jacob saw a ladder reaching between him and God, to connect them. Jacob could never climb to heaven himself, so God made the connection for him. Just like Jacob, we have a huge distance between us and God. It's longer than a measuring tape, and can't be measured by anything. Place the cross on the ladder. Jesus came to earth to be our ladder. pillow Give students a pillow to wrestle with one at a time. As they do, name things that we "wrestle" with spiritually.

When we know what God wants us to do, but we don't want to do it, it can feel like we're wrestling with God. God wants us to give in to Him. If we don't do it willingly, He might choose to let us get hurt by the things we want in order to learn our lesson.

Jacob was worried that his brother would still be mad. He showed humility in calling him master. He offered gifts to help make up for what he had done. Esau was just happy to see his brother again. He did not want revenge anymore. He was not angry. When Jacob saw this, he said it was like seeing God's face. What could this mean? When we forgive others, are we showing God to them? How?

can of seltzer

Remember how angry Esau was when Jacob left? He was ready to explode with rage. But after twenty years, he had had time to calm down. Take the can of seltzer and open it. Just like this can of soda only needed a few minutes, you should normally only need a few minutes to calm down when you are angry at someone. You can take a minute to pray and ask God to help you calm down.

Closing:

Draw a smiley face on a tennis ball. Each time someone is mean to us; we should bounce back with gentle words. Have students make a line in the hall and let them take turns throwing the ball against the wall. For each example of meanness, try to think of a gentle response.

Someone takes the seat you saved for your friend.






**Normal Hip:**
