

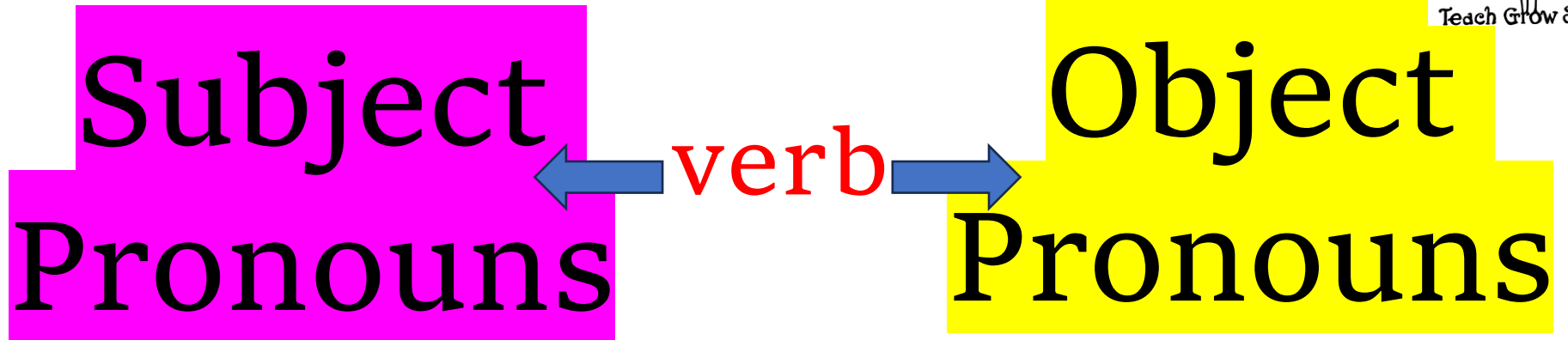

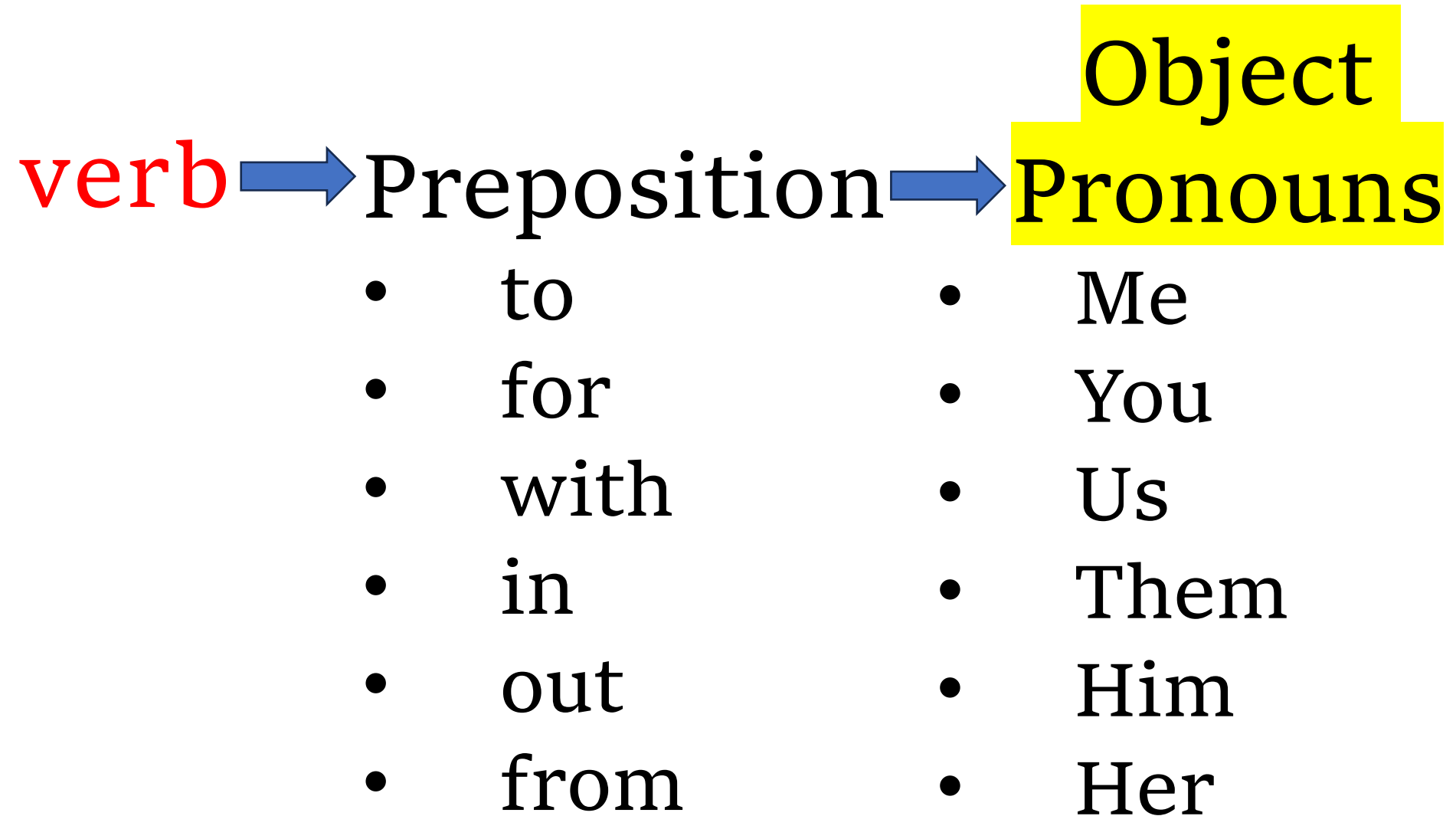

She went to a party. The party was for her.

Pronoun- Antecedent Agreement

- The antecedent of a pronoun is the noun or nouns that the pronoun replaces
- The antecedent and pronoun must agree in number and gender

Antecedent

The word a pronoun replaces.

The **boy** was smart, even though **he** did not test well.



The **students** started running because **they** were late.



Jen ate her lunch quickly, because **she** wanted to get dessert.
