## Introduction:

Have one child (the shepherd) stand in the middle of the room wearing a blindfold.

Put cotton balls on the floor (the sheep).

All the other children stand around the circle and are the wolves.

The wolves try to snatch a cotton sheep one at a time.

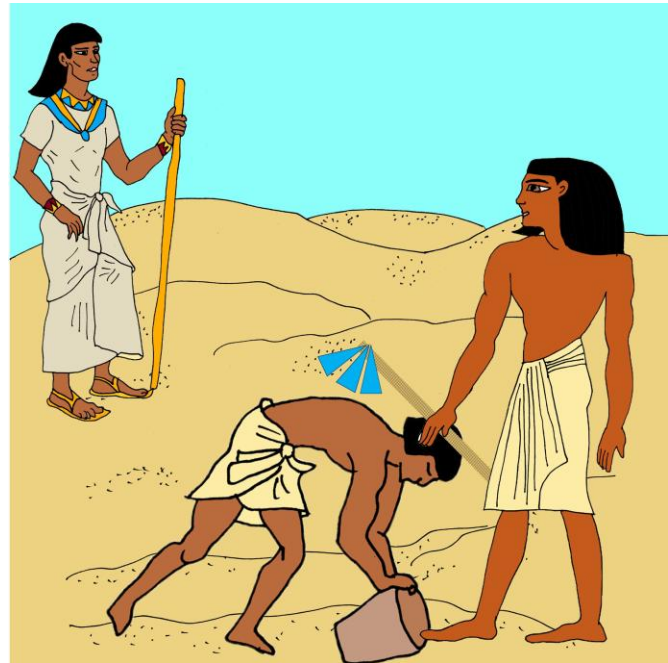
The shepherd must try to tag them to get them out of the game.

When all of the wolves are tagged or all of the sheep are captured, the game is over.

Talk about how difficult the life of a shepherd is.

Do you think it is easier or harder than being a prince in Egypt?

## Closing Discussion:

What did Moses do that got him in trouble? (fought with an Egyptian)  
If someone is being mean to someone else, should we pick a fight with them?  
Will this solve the problem? (no)  
How did God get Moses' attention? (burning bush)  
Why was this strange? (normally, when something catches on fire, it burns up and turns into ashes)  
What do we call it when God does something amazing like this? (a miracle)  
Pharaoh was a bully.  
It took a lot of courage for Moses to go to him.  
It also took a lot of self-control.  
Did Moses have self-control when he was a prince and picked that fight? (no)  
If you have to deal with someone who is mean, you can ask God to help you stay in control of yourself and not get angry.  
He will give you the right words to say so that you can make peace.

In the hall, have children stand at one end and walk to the burning bush one at a time. Have them take off their shoes and leave them in front, and stand to the side. When you say, "Let My people go!" children can all put their shoes on to see who finishes first.
