





Topic:	Burning Bush
Intro:	<p>Show students a tube of toothpaste. What are some things people do when they get mad? (hit, kick, call a name, yell, throw a tantrum, act rude) For each item, squeeze out some toothpaste. Can I put the toothpaste back in the tube? It's the same with the things we do and say. When you call someone a name, you can't unsay it. When you hit someone, you can't unhit them. When you scream at your mom, you can't unscream. God wants us to have self-control so that we can keep from doing these things. Moses didn't have very good self-control at the start of our story.</p>

	<p>Who gave you your name? (mostly parents) Who gave God His name? (nobody) The name of God, "I AM WHO I AM," means "the self-existent one." God is all-powerful and self-existing. He has no beginning or end. He was not created like the statues the Egyptians worshiped. They made up names for their gods.</p>



Closing:

Give each student a piece of aluminum foil big enough to cover their face. Ask them to press the foil onto their face for two seconds to create a mold. Compare everyone's mold. Are they all different? Ask students to name the fruits of the Spirit. With each one, press their molds to your face. Now all the molds have the teacher's face.

When you are a student of God, someone who follows Him and spends every day trying to learn more from Him, you slowly become more like Him. When we give control of our lives-the words we say and the actions we choose-we are letting God mold us to be more like Him. Real self-control is giving control of yourself over to God.




