Mix & Match Flip Book



Have children draw different people, animals, or made-up creatures on each page. Make sure to put only the head on the top section, the torso in the middle, and the legs, or other bottom, in the bottom section. The black dots can be used to gage where shoulders and hips should be in order to help each creature stay lined up with the others. Students then staple all pages together and cut on the dotted lines (or you can use a paper cutter to slice through many pages at once).


The result will be a fun flip book they have made themselves to mix and match funny looking people or creatures.

If easier, the version with a child outline can be used instead.

Other ways to use this:

Halloween: Mix and match different monsters.

Beginning of the Year: Students draw themselves, then all pictures are put together to make a mix & match book for your classroom library. Seasons: Students draw how to dress for each month or season.
