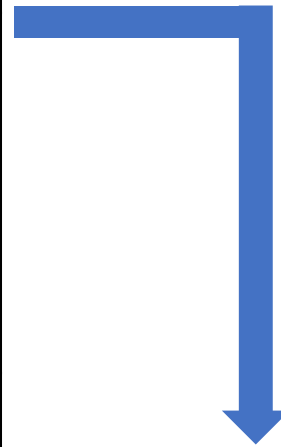

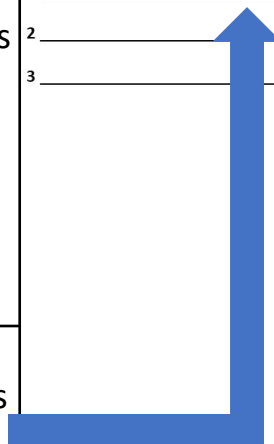
Topic:	Ruth

Showing kindness to them helps them to see what God is like. Not everyone you are kind to will choose to believe in God, but they will still see you as a good example of how God's followers behave. We can't know ahead of time who will want to follow God because of us, we just have to show kindness to everyone and see what happens.

spaghetti	<p>Spread spaghetti on the table. Ask everyone to pick up all the whole pieces (if you break it, don't take it). See who collected the most. There are still small bits left over. In God's law, after the harvest workers had grabbed big handfuls of crops, whatever was left over on the ground was for poor people to pick up. This was how God made sure that no one would go hungry. Imagine doing this all day just to make enough bread to not go hungry. When Ruth picked up leftover grain, she had a lot of work to do just to make bread for her and Naomi.</p>

	<p>How did Boaz show kindness to Ruth? (he had her join the other women, he told the men not to bother her, he offered her water) Why did this surprise Ruth? (she was an immigrant) Some people did not trust Moabites because Israel had fought battles against Moab and they had been enemies in the past. But the Bible commanded the Israelites to show kindness to everyone. Why was Boaz impressed with Ruth? (she had left everything she knew to help Naomi; she worked very hard)</p>
	<p>Because Boaz had been so kind to Ruth, Naomi suggested that they should get married. Ruth talked to Boaz and he was happy to say yes. Back then land was divided up so that no family had more than any other. To make sure they were following the rules correctly, Boaz first had to check with some other relatives.</p>

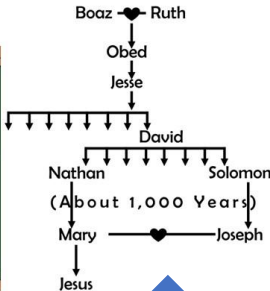

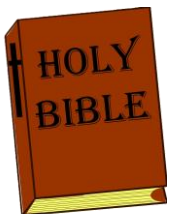
	What does Boaz say about Ruth? (she is loyal, respected) How does he react to Ruth's proposal? (he blesses her, praises her, wants to do the right thing)

Naomi took the child, laid him in her bosom, and became nurse to him. The women, her neighbors, gave him a name, saying, "A son is born to Naomi". They named him Obed. He is the father of Jesse, the father of David.
	This story is mainly in the Bible so we know about King David's family. But it also shows us how everyday people showed kindness to each other in Bible times. Ruth showed kindness to Naomi, and God blessed her for it. Boaz showed kindness to Ruth by watching out for her. Naomi's kindness to Ruth is probably what made her want to stay with her and worship God.
Note to Teacher:	Since the early church period, many bible scholars have believed that the genealogy found in Luke is for Mary's side, as there was no word in the original language for son-in-law versus son.
Closing:	Spread out magnets & magnetic objects. Have children play with them. Ask them to share what they already know about magnets. Ruth stuck by Naomi like a magnet. She was loyal and kind to her. What are some ways we can stick by our friends when they are going through hard times?
