Topic:	Hannah and Samuel
Prep:	Cut a melon and onion in half, then place the halves back together so that they look like they have not been cut.
Intro:	Show the children the melon and open it. If you had never seen a melon before, you would be surprised to see how different it is on the inside. Show them the onion and open it. An onion is the same all the way through, layer after layer.

	Hannah wanted a child very badly. She could have just asked God for one. Why do you think she offered to give her son back to God? (she understood all gifts are from God and belong to Him, she wanted to thank God for the son, she believed her son would be closer to God) Hannah was promising to make her son a Nazarite. This was a group of people who never cut their hair or tasted any kind of grapes. These were both symbols of belonging to this group (like police officers and nurses wear special uniforms to show who they are).

	<p>Do you think God gets upset if we show our true feelings when we are praying to Him? Re-read Hannah's prayer in a monotone voice, making it obvious you are reading from the paper. Is that the way to open your heart up to God? God knows what is in our hearts. We don't need to hide how we're feeling from Him. If you are very sad (or angry, or frustrated), tell God all about it in prayer. You can be completely blunt with Him. There are no feelings you need to be embarrassed about.</p>



Hannah kept Samuel at home while he was little and took care of her baby. When he was old enough, did she keep her promise to God? It might seem strange that Hannah would send her son to live at the temple at such a young age, but life back then was very different. Today, children go to a school every day and come back home every night. They live at home until they are eighteen. Life has only been like this for a couple hundred years. Children used to go and live with the person who's job they were learning starting at a very young age. So Samuel was only leaving home a little bit earlier than what was normal.



Closing:

Hand children the prayer questionnaire. Make sure no one (including adults) looks at anyone else's answers. Have them check all that apply. Explain that this is to help them understand what is in their hearts right now. Emphasize that you want them to answer totally honestly. Since you won't be looking at it, they don't need to write down the answers they think you want to hear.

Read the bible passages and guide children to (re-)think about the answers. Explain that prayer is about talking to God with the same openness that they might talk to themselves. God knows what they think better than even they know.
