

Weekly Inferencing Practice

Use these pages as a weekly warm-up to help children practice their inferencing skills. The level of difficulty will vary according to student experiences and exposure through reading, but can offer great opportunities to recognize gaps in world/life knowledge.

Place these on student desks when they walk in and after a few minutes, students can discuss their answers and how they came to them.

Project the pages onto the board and underline the clue words that led students to their conclusions.
