
If one vowel comes before two consonants, the vowel should be short. Color Short Vowels blue.



If one vowel comes before one consonant, the vowel will USUALLY be long. Color Long Vowels red.



Sometimes NG digraphs don't make the NG sound when they come before Digraph ER. The vowel follows the same pattern it would for an NG digraph, but the G is soft.






Sometimes the G in an NG digraph will make two sounds before Digraph ER. First, it will help make the NG sound, then, it will make a regular (hard) G sound.

A Home for Birds




