A Dessert Island

Technically, Antarctica is a desert island, because it gets so little precipitation. But what about all that snow? Because it is so cold in Antarctica, the small amounts of snow that do fall each year never melt, so over a long period of time, they have piled up.

You also would not want to get stuck on a deserted island. If a place is deserted, it means there is no one there. If a person gets deserted, it means others have left them alone.
